Saoil dé mar a **tha** Alasdair? **Tha e** sgith, bhon a **tha** móran obair aige. **Tha an** cat a-staigh, ge-ta. **Tha sin** gasta, ach **tha** beagan acras air a' chat. **Tha e a'** suidhe aig an uinneag le Maighread. **Tha e** fuar a-mach, ach 's e **latha math** a th' ann. Chan eil e fliuch idir – gu dearbh, **tha e** glé bhriagh **an-diugh**.

NEW CONCEPTS:

saoil – this word is used before a question in order to say “I wonder” or “pray tell”

air a' chat – “on the cat” (**cat** is masc. but **air** – like all prepositions *ie* words that communicate something about the position of one thing relative to another – turns the following article fem. and lenites the noun. Other examples are: **air a' bhòrd** [on the table] **aig a' chù** [at *ie* belonging to the dog])

NEW WORDS:

a-mach – out, outside (opposite of **a-staigh**)

an-diugh – today

bhon – because, from the (**bh** in this case is pronounced more like /f/)

ge-ta – though, however (*lit.* though-is)

idir – at all, in any way

latha – day (**latha math!** fine lit. good day!)

le – with
